Q: I see a crack starting to form in my denture and I really cannot afford a new one right now. If my denture breaks, can I just glue it back together? What kind of glue can I use?

A: I can tell you are a do-it-yourselfer. Dentures can be repaired without

going to the expense of a new one. In fact, your denture can be repaired now, before it fractures more.

Using any type of glue is not a good plan. The pieces must match exactly back together for the denture to fit properly. Some types of glues actually melt the denture material, making it impossible to repair. Super glue is not effective in the wet environment of the mouth.

A professional repair takes only a few hours and is relatively inexpensive. You will

have your denture back the same day. I do free repairs for patients who are planning a new denture, as a courtesy. Believe me, free is good!
